I: Allegro Maestoso

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791) was a prolific and influential composer of the Classical era. It is known through letters and concert announcements that he wrote a sinfonia concertante for flute, oboe, horn, and bassoon; however, there is some debate whether he authored this particular piece.

Originally composed for orchestra and winds, the piano imitates the orchestra in this arrangement. The piece begins by introducing several themes, first in the piano and then in the winds. In the middle, Mozart plays with and recombines these themes, handing them off between the instruments. Finally the main themes are brought back again leading to the conclusion of the movement.

Sextet for Piano & Winds, Op. 100......Poulenc

II: Divertissement

Francis Jean Marcel Poulenc (1899-1963) was a composer and pianist. His wealthy family intended him for a business career and did not allow him to enroll at a music college, so he was largely self-educated musically.

The second movement of the Poulenc Sextet, "Divertissement" contains an exquisite and melancholy melody that is passed back and forth by all six players, contrasted with a faster, energetic section that is almost comedic in character.

III: Andante
II: Allegretto

Max Brauer (1855-1918) was a lesser known but highly skilled German composer of the Romantic era, who is reminiscent of Brahms.

The Andante movement features the French horn, an unlikely instrument for an extended solo in woodwind music. Usually the horn carries a bass or alto line, so the fact that Brauer explores this opportunity is a welcome idea for horn players everywhere. The Allegretto movement is in a dance form, giving a nod back to the dance forms that paved the way for much of music history. Its lighthearted character leaves the audience at ease.

Sonata No. 2 for Flute, Clarinet & PianoSchocker

II: Old Flame

I: Flip

Gary Schocker (1959) is a flutist, pianist, and composer, recognized as the most-published living composer of flute music with over 200 works.

Commissioned by the Palisades Virtuosi, the sonata is a joyous fusion of beauty and wit. The Old Flame movement is a beautiful melancholic longing. The Flip movement brightens the mood with its quick interplay between the three performers, handing melodic elements back and forth among them.

Sextet for Piano & Wind Quintet Op. 6.....Thuille

II: Gavotte

Ludwig Thuille (1861-1907) was a German professor and composer well versed in most genres including chamber music.

Thuille composed this four-movement Sextet in 1888, encouraged by his life-long friend Richard Strauss, who was instrumental in arranging for its premiere performance. The gavotte is an animated dance.
